

## **Grammar Art**

One of the seven elements of art is texture. Early this past fall our third grade students studied the art of Georges Seurat and his beautiful example of texture by using pointillism. Students made a rich fall forest using q-tips and acrylic paint to create this pointillism effect. Although touching art is typically not permitted, I encouraged the third graders to feel their work as well as look at it.

Our fifth graders take time to look at the basic shapes that are foundational for artists to explore still life. Their project involves working with photographs of these shapes and recreating them in all of their shape, form, and value using 3 different mediums: pencil, colored pencil, & chalk pastel.

Our kindergarten classroom starts the year immersed into the art of Piet Mondrian and his simplicity in using primary color, line and shape. Our young students still thrive on using a variety of fun mediums, and tools to learn. In this project two of the 7 art elements are taught: line & shape. They learn about line and shape by printing the lines using cardboard. They learn quickly that once the lines close, a shape is made. They use oil pastel to color in the shape.





## Secondary Art

In the rhetoric years of High School Art, students build on their understanding of drawing and begin to explore meaning and intention in their art-making. Students are challenged to apply their critical thinking and problem-solving prowess to the creative process in order to hone their skills as they respond visually to God's amazing creation. Mrs Bontrager teaches the following classes currently available to high school students:

In **Art 1A Drawing**, students create from life, applying the practice of observation and "seeing" artistically, learning to more accurately render the world around them.

In **Art 1B Color and Design**, students build their understanding of color theory and design through the use of chalk and oil pastels, ink, and watercolor, creating projects that apply the principles of design.

In **Art 2A Advanced Drawing**, students who have completed both Art 1A and 1B review drawing techniques and engage in longer, more challenging drawing sessions. Students draw primarily from life, studying both object and human form.

In **Art 2B Advanced Media**, students who have completed both Art 1A and 1B will apply their drawing skills and knowledge of color theory and design to projects that explore painting, collage, sculpture, and mixed media.

In **Art Independent Study**, students who have completed both the Art 1 and Art 2 classes, may work with the High School Art teacher to create an individualized plan for a trimester of independent study and studio practice.
